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Manuscripts submitted in Ukrainian and English are accepted for publication. Priority is given to manuscripts written in English. A maximum of five authors is allowed per publication. All articles undergo anonymous peer review by independent experts. The editorial team reserves the right to edit the submitted materials.

All article must contain the following components:

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A scholarly article must include such **structural components**:

Introduction: general problem statement; analysis of recent research and publications that initiated the solution to the relevant problem and on which the author relies; identification of previously unresolved aspects of the general problem.

Research purpose: 2-3 sentences which formulate the problem or hypothesis addressed by the author and explain its significance.

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Data processing: the section should specify the methods used for data processing and analysis, including the name and version of the software applied for statistical evaluation

Results: they should be presented in a clear and logical sequence without references to the literature. Data must be shown concisely, using descriptive text supported by graphs, tables, and figures, all of which should be numbered and properly titled.

Discussion: the section should emphasize the novel and important aspects of the research findings. It involves analyzing possible mechanisms or interpretations of the data, where possible, comparing them with results from other studies. Avoid repeating information already presented in the Introduction. The discussion may also include well-founded practical recommendations and suggest potential applications of the results in healthcare and directions for future research.

Prospects for further research: it typically consists of 2-3 sentences indicating potential areas for deeper investigation or development.

Conclusions: summarize the key findings of the study, highlighting what was achieved and their possible implications or significance. Reflect on prospects for the use of these findings.

Bibliography. It must not contain abbreviations in the original language. All sources should be provided in transliterated form, following the Vancouver referencing style. References must be listed in the order they are cited in the text. In-text citations should be indicated using numbers in square brackets. Original research articles must include a minimum of 15 scholarly sources published within the last 10 years. Review articles should contain between 35 and 50 references. For journal articles cited by the author, the DOI must be provided at the end of each bibliographic entry. The use of internet sources of a non-scholarly or journalistic nature is not permitted. Self-citations must not exceed 10% of the total number of cited sources.

References. To ensure the active integration of articles from a scholarly professional publication into the circulation of scientific information and to enable accurate indexing by scientometric databases, each article must include a "References" section. This section must contain a Latin-alphabet version of the full list of cited sources. All sources originally written in Cyrillic must be transliterated, with the article title translated into English and placed in square brackets.

<u>Vancouver style</u>

Prohibition on using the aggressor state's scholarly papers

It is prohibited citing and including in the reference list russian-language papers published in any country, including papers written in other languages but published in russia and belarus.

Abstract in Ukrainian and English (The abstract must be provided in both Ukrainian and English). If the article is written in Ukrainian, the primary abstract should be in Ukrainian, and the extended abstract in English. If the article is written in English, the primary abstract should be in English, and the extended abstract in Ukrainian. The primary abstract should contain 200–250 words. The extended abstract should contain 500–550 words. Each abstract must include the following components: **research purpose, materials and methods, research results, and conclusions** (key findings of the study).

Keywords: 5–8 keywords that do not duplicate the article title.

The last page of the manuscript must include the following information about each author: full name, academic degree, academic title, institutional affiliation and position, postal address, e-mail, and ORCID ID.

In addition, each author's contribution should be specified according to the following categories:

- A concept and design
- B data collection and analysis
- C responsibility for statistical analysis
- D drafting the manuscript
- E critical revision
- F final approval of the manuscript

Corresponding e-mail: corresponding author's full name, institutional address, contact phone number, and e-mail. All correspondence regarding the review' outcome, comments, and publication details will be sent to this email.

Technical requirements: line spacing - 1.5, without hyphens, font - Times New Roman, size - 14, MICROSOFT WORD. Paragraph indentation - 1.25 cm. Margins: left, top, and bottom - 2.5 cm, and right - 2 cm.
